In May 2015, you appointed me to the Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure Board to complete a term that filled the former Republican legislator position. That appointment ended in January 2016, and I was then reappointed and served until *sine die* on May 23, 2016. During the confirmation process, both the Senate Rules and Administration Committee and the House Government Operations and Elections Policy Committee unanimously recommended my confirmation, but final floor votes were not taken. I reapplied after the position was posted and you appointed me to serve until January 2017.

As in 2016, I was reappointed in January and served until my term ended when the legislature failed to act on confirmation by April 21, 2017. I am applying again for the same seat as I have enjoyed serving on the CFB and believe strongly in the importance of its work in maintaining the integrity of our state elections. He occupies a Board position for a member who has not been a public official, held any political party office other than precinct delegate, or been elected to public office for which party designation is required by statute in the three years preceding the member's appointment. Mr. Moilanen supports the DFL Party. Mr. Moilanen is a graduate of Gustavus Adolphus College and George Washington University Law School. Mr. Moilanen spent the early part of his legal career working in the public sector. Subsequently, he spent nearly thirty years in the private practice of law with the majority of that time spent as a partner at the law firm of Popham, Haik, Schnobrich, Kaufman and Doty. His private practice primarily focused on securities fraud. Mr. Moilanen concluded his professional career working as the Director of Securities for the State of Minnesota from 2011-2014.
