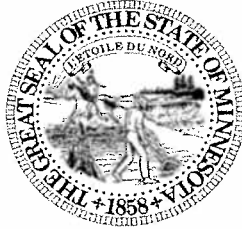





Please consider my application for reappointment to the Metropolitan Council, District 3. For the past two years, I have served the region and demonstrated my commitment to transportation choices, beautiful parks, clean water, and housing opportunities for all people. I want to continue building strong partnerships that make our region an even better place to live, work, and play.

My skills, experience and constituencies are well suited to the job:

- As **board chair of Transit for Livable Communities**, I led the largest transportation advocacy organization in Minnesota with 15,000 activists. We promote a transportation system that encourages transit ridership, walking, bicycling, and thoughtful development.
- I was **responsible for public involvement and public relations for the Hiawatha Light Rail Line**.
- As a **resident of Minnetonka**, I live a few blocks from the Southwest Light Rail Corridor and I understand suburban residents who crave transportation choices. We're spending more time in traffic than with our families and it's dangerous for us to walk and bicycle in neighborhoods designed for autos instead of people.
- As **public affairs director for AFSCME Council 5**, I advocate for workers who ride the buses and trains – 15,000 of our union members work along the Central Corridor.

As a Metropolitan Council member, I am committed to:

- **Public Participation.** Community members must have a meaningful voice in government decisions that affect their daily lives.
- **Access.** Minnesotans deserve more and better transportation choices that provide convenient, safe, and affordable access to jobs, education, recreation, goods and services.
- **Healthy Communities.** A balanced transportation system will reduce soil, water and air pollution, preserve open space, promote greater human health, and increase the sustainability of our climate and other ecological resources.
- **Equitable Development.** Regional investments should be focused at reducing economic, health and social disparities among people in our region.

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

Council Member ■ Metropolitan Council (March 2011 – present)

- Appointed by Gov. Dayton to lead the regional planning agency for the seven-county Twin Cities metro area and to advocate for vital communities and cost-effective regional services, including public transit, wastewater treatment, regional parks, and affordable housing.
- Represent District 3, which includes the Hennepin County cities of Chanhassen, Deephaven, Eden Prairie, Excelsior, Greenwood, Hopkins, Long Lake, Minnetonka, Minnetonka Beach, Mound, Orono, Shorwood, Spring Park, Tonka Bay, Wayzata, and Woodland.
