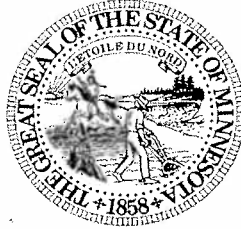

President of the Senate

I wish to be considered for a third term of membership on the Governor's Clean Water Council as the University of Minnesota/Higher Educational System representative. I have served in this capacity for the last six years. I am the Co-Director of the University of Minnesota's Water Resources Center, which promotes research, teaching, and outreach of water issues to the University and to the citizens of the State of Minnesota. In my capacity as Co-Director, I am well-acquainted with the US Clean Water Act, the Minnesota Clean Water Legacy Act, the activities and responsibilities of the Clean Water Council, and the issues surrounding the State's impaired waters. I was the representative of the University of Minnesota on the "G-40", the advisory group that provided stakeholder feedback to the "G-16" who crafted the Clean Water Legacy Act. I also was the lead author of the multi-stakeholder Minnesota Water Sustainability Framework, a legislatively requested 25 year plan for how to achieve sustainable management of the state's water resources.

I am a professor of environmental chemistry in the University of Minnesota's School of Public Health, Division of Environmental Health Sciences. I am also a professor in Science, Technology and Environmental Policy at the Humphrey School of Public Affairs. My research interests and current projects are detailed in the attached Curriculum Vita. I have had considerable experience working with committees and councils in an advisory capacity. I have served as Chair of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Science Advisory Board for the past 4 years. I also serve on the Science Advisory Board of the International Joint Commission of the US and Canada. In 2011 I served as the President of the National Institutes of Water Resources. I feel that my experience and perspective would be representative of higher education in the state and valuable to the Council. Thank you for considering me for this nomination.
