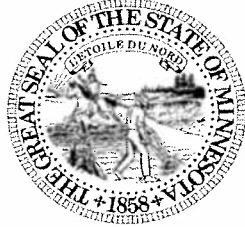

Cover Letter or Other Helpful Information:

I am applying for reappointment as Council Member for Metropolitan Council District 16. I have served in that position since April 2009.

During my time on the Council, I have served effectively in a variety of roles, including serving as the vice chair of the Environmental Services Committee, chair of the I/I Demand Charge Task Force and the Regional Transitway Guidelines Advisory Committee. I am also a member of the Community Development Committee, and the liaison to the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission.

The I/I Demand Charge Task Force completed its work in 2010, working collaboratively with city officials to continue to the very effective inflow and infiltration work that has saved the region approximately \$2 billion in infrastructure costs. The Regional Transitway Guidelines Advisory Committee spanned both the Pawlenty Council and the current Council, and we worked with a variety of regional stakeholders to coordinate regional planning for our expanding transitway system.

I have participated in a number of other committees and task forces, solving complex issues, and bringing together a people from different backgrounds to find solutions that work for all of our stakeholders.

Prior to my appointment to the Met Council, I had significant experience on the state and regional level, serving on the Met Council's Transportation Advisory Board and Land Use Advisory Committee, and as a member of the Board of Directors for the League of Minnesota Cities and of the Metropolitan Legislative Commission. I was also involved in the creation of the Dakota County High Performance Partnerships Initiative.

I represented Lakeville on the City Council for 6 years, and served on the Planning Commission for seven years prior to my election, with one year as chair. During that time, Lakeville was the fastest growing city in District 16, as well as the fastest growing in Dakota County, adding more than 20,000 residents, and more than \$375 million in commercial and industrial development.

In addition to the successful review of comprehensive plan updates at the regional level, I participated in two successful comprehensive plan updates at the city level, and I am very well acquainted with the issues related to planning, growth, and development, having worked on a variety of types of commercial and residential development, including redevelopment and infill development. During my city tenure, Lakeville was a leader in creative solutions to difficult development issues – we were the first city to advance fund trunk highway improvements via bonding, and were the first city to propose staged MUSA expansions. We have also been a regional leader on environmental protection, with the only urban trout stream that actually has trout in it.

I represented the city council in the preparation of our downtown guide plan, and am a longtime volunteer with the Downtown Lakeville Business Association. We have successfully encouraged historic preservation, and our downtown area is thriving and growing, without the use of eminent domain.

As a City Council Member, I successfully crafted an agreement whereby the Lakeville City Council voted unanimously to join the transit taxing district, but offset the tax impact by cutting the city budget. We were the first city to join the transit taxing district in more than two decades, which has since led to several other communities opting to join the regional transit taxing district.

I have shown the necessary skills and experience to be a very effective member of the Met Council, and would happy to continue to serve if reappointed.
