Resume or Other Helpful Information:

Nancy Gibson is best known for her effort to build the International Wolf Center in Ely. She joined the board in 1987 and poured her energy into raising the necessary funds to build the Center from the Minnesota State Legislature and private sources. She was one of the Center's first board chairs and has remained on the board serving various committees ever since.

Nancy also helped lead the successful 2008 Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment that will protect large areas for wolves and other species in Minnesota. She currently co-chairs the Legislative Commission that distributes annual funds from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund to research, environmental education, parks and trails and critical natural resources across Minnesota. Her policy involvement has her engaged in several issues from sulfide mining, invasive species to toxic pollutants affecting children. She serves on three non-profit boards.

She works and consults as the naturalist for several media outlets in Minnesota. Her education skills won two Emmys for her talent on the award-winning PBS show, Newton's Apple. Nancy won the Willard Munger Stewardship Award, conservation awards from Ducks Unlimited, Friends of the Boundary Waters and was honored as one of the 50 top women in Minnesota by First Lady Mary Pawlenty.

Her first book WOLVES was published in 1996 and she is a regular contributor to various natural resource publications.

Nancy was part of the team that introduced wolves into Yellowstone National park and Idaho in 1995 and 1996. In addition, Nancy has traveled to many parts of the world to observe wolves including Ethiopia, Mongolia, Poland, Sweden, 13 summers in the Northwest Territory and three summers in Ellesmere Island working with Dr. David Mech. She conducts educational programs for the Center and has guided trips to the Northwest Territories and Yellowstone National Park in search of wolves.
