

- Developed operations orders to direct soldier readiness processing, new equipment fielding and for units developing plans for unit mobilization.
- Managed staff of 16 trainers to responsible for validating individual training task required to be completed prior to mobilization.
- Consistently delivered units to mobilization stations with less than 3% non-deployable rates which was the best in the entire Army National Guard.

- Directly responsible for the supervision of 48 staff officers and non-commissioned officers.
- Saved lives through increasing force protection capabilities at all locations through rebuilding exterior defense and hardening facilities to survive incoming mortar and rocket attacks.
