

To The Office of Minnesota Secretary of State:

I am seeking to be the classroom teacher representative on the Board of School Administrators. I have been an English/ Language Arts teacher for almost nineteen years and an unwavering social justice activist for a lifetime. From starting student support groups like GSA to facilitating faculty development like SEED, I have been a leader in social justice and multicultural education advocacy. For these efforts, I have received several awards, including Education Minnesota's 2016 Human Rights Award, Minnesota Teacher of the Year 2013 finalist, and Mahtomedi 2012 Teacher of the Year. At the core of my teaching philosophy has been one central focus: empowerment.

Empowering students often means allowing them to choose their own path: reading material, writing assignments, or action-research projects. It can mean supporting students' ideas even while challenging their preconceived ones. Sometimes it means empowering them to acknowledge mistakes without judgment or shame. Students often turn to teachers for the correct answers, but I just as often meet my students with more questions that open up new possibilities. Inquiry and project-based discovery do not have a check-list of items that are always in clear sequential order or that can be assessed on a multiple choice test.

My efforts towards student empowerment extend outside the classroom to the school community. I have worked my entire career to create a safe and inclusive educational environment for all students, but particularly Lesbian, Gay, Bi-Sexual, Transgender and Queer students, staff, and families. Although I work to foster inclusiveness within my own classroom, I believe that true inclusiveness should be fostered throughout the school community. Two years ago, in response to racial tension and harassment at my school, I encouraged students of color to create a racial justice student group. The group grew to include white allies. They call themselves SAFE: Students Advocating For Equity.

The truth about teaching and social justice work is that no one can or should work in isolation. Collaboration has been the key to my professional growth as well as the success of my equity initiatives. Any school team should foster innovation and collaboration in order to improve student learning. Further, I desire administrative leadership that shares these views and works to create infrastructure that supports them.

A word that people often use to describe me is passionate. I love teaching. I am proud of the curriculum and pedagogy I have developed over the years. However, I am more proud of the relationships I have made with students, parents and colleagues. Relationships are at the heart of all I do.
