T. Geron (Jerry) Bell was named Chairman of the Twins Executive Board on January 3, 2011. He serves as an advisor to ownership and the team's senior management group on a variety of club operational issues as well as facility development.

Prior to his current role, Bell served as President of Twins Sports, Inc. Named to that post on November 26, 2002, he led the effort to ensure the long-term viability of the Minnesota Twins and specifically oversaw the development, design, construction and the opening of Target Field. Bell's leadership was central to the ballpark's ground-breaking design, LEED certification and successful management of the project's budget and timeline.

Bell, who was named the third president in club history in January, 1987, spent 16 years as the chief executive of the club. He led the team's business operations and was instrumental in the 1987 and 1991 World Championship seasons. Other accomplishments include setting an American League attendance record in 1988, when the Twins became the first junior-circuit team to attract more than three million fans. He also led the development and construction of Minnesota's spring training facility, Lee County Sports Complex, located in Ft. Myers, FL, which opened in 1991.

Bell joined the Twins after serving as Executive Director of the Metropolitan Sports Facilities Commission (MSFC), which formerly operated the Metrodome. He joined the MSFC as Assistant Executive Director upon the commission's inception in 1977.

His past professional activities include: a member of Major League Baseball's Professional Baseball Association Committee/Baseball Operations Committee, the Hall of Fame Veteran's Committee for Major League Baseball, three terms as member of the North St. Paul/Maplewood School Board, including five years as chairman; serving on the Minneapolis Downtown Council Board of Directors from 1993-2002; member of the Minneapolis Chamber of Commerce Communications Committee; Board of Directors for the Greater Convention and Visitors Association; member of the Executive Committee of the Minneapolis/St. Paul Final Four organizing committee and former consultant to the Miami Dolphins, Ltd., of the NFL. In 2010, Bell was the recipient of the Herb Carneal Lifetime Achievement Award as presented by the Minnesota chapter of the Baseball Writers Association of America.

Currently, Bell is serving on the Destination Medical Center (DMC) Economic Development Agency Board (EDA) for the Mayo Clinic, while also chairing the City of Minneapolis Implementation Committee for proposed renovations of Target Center.

Jerry and his wife, Phyllis, who make their home in North St. Paul, MN, have two daughters.

Jerry retired from the Minnesota Twins in August of 2014.
