To Whom it May Concern:

I am writing to express an interest in a reappointment to the Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board (PELSB) membership as the Related Service Provider-Teacher representative. I have served in this capacity since the new Board was constituted and have an interest in continuing with the work that we have started. I am currently employed as a Speech-Language Pathologist in the Anoka Hennepin School District with experience and educational background in administration. I feel that my experiences and qualifications make me a desirable candidate for this position.

As reflected in my resume, I am currently practicing as a Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP) in an educational setting and also have extensive experience within the profession in state level leadership, "service" at the national level in evaluation of preservice academic programs, and awareness of licensing and practice expectations through mentorship, practicum student and Clinical Fellowship supervision in the area of Communication Disorders. I also have experience and expertise in educational administration and supervision that has provided me with an enriched sense of areas of skill acquisition and application that is, I believe, more comprehensive, relevant and sensitive to workplace demands.

The PELSB has experienced developmental struggles since its inception and it has been through this process that I have come to recognize the challenges and benefits of serving in a volunteer capacity devoted to the educational profession. We have been focused on articulating the statutory vision, through rule making and operations, of educator licensing that is sensitive to the varied needs of the State while maintaining the value of having high quality, specially trained individuals in front of our children and youth. Related Service professionals have a unique and specialized role in our educational system that complements teachers but extends beyond the curricular and instructional domains. Unfortunately we are quite often identified as professionals in short supply and in "significant shortage" across the state.

By including a related service representative on the PELSB, the legislature has recognized the need for strategic consideration of the unique perspectives we have regarding professional standards and licensing issues. Our educational Related Services professionals (Speech Language Pathologists, Social Worker, School Counselors, School Psychologists, and School Nurses) provide necessary and complementary intervention for the students but also require varied backgrounds and educational experiences that are very different than those of teachers. I have been able to express the perspectives of and advocate for my own profession as well as those of the other service providers in my role on the PELSB.

I would like to have the opportunity to continue in this role. Thank you for your consideration. I look forward to hearing from you.
