I am excited to have the opportunity to apply for reappointment as the Councilmember for District 16. Since I was appointed nearly 14 years ago, I have served under three administrations, and six council chairs. I have worked collaboratively with a wide variety of stakeholders, with the philosophy that the Council should prove its worth to the entire region every day. As the longest serving member of the current council, I provide important institutional memory for my fellow councilmembers and for our staff.


I have a history of bringing people together and getting things done. Immediately after my initial appointment to the Metropolitan Council, I led the process to decrease the Sewer Availability Charge (SAC) for restaurant patio seating, solving a long-standing problem that had hampered development in the industry. In 2017, I led a SAC task force requested by the legislature. After fending off attempts at a quick political fix, we successfully adopted changes that were far superior to the original proposal, streamlining the process, while still retaining fairness and financial accountability. During COVID, I led efforts to work collaboratively with city officials to help restaurant owners adapt their spaces for social distancing, without creating an undue financial burden.

In the Army Reserve, I developed a passion for service. Since then, I have worked on local, regional, and state policy issues, going wherever I can make a difference. From supporting community policing efforts in Minneapolis via the Southeast Asian Community Leaders Forum, to serving as a League of Minnesota Cities board member, I have worked toward making life better for everyone in our state.

I did not come to this point by a traditional path. In 2005, I was raising kids, running my web design business and serving as a Lakeville City Council Member. My husband, Dan, suffered a traumatic brain injury when he was injured by a blast during a training exercise. Since then, I have been his caregiver. In doing so, I have developed exceptional patience and problem-solving skills, even in highly stressful situations. I have also used that experience to help others, founding the Minnesota Association for Injured Peace Officers, where Dan and I mentor other injured cops and their families. I don't have a political agenda, just a desire to make things work well.

I have spent years building up goodwill across the political spectrum, by being honest, forthright, and caring. I have always had a One Minnesota vision and would be honored to be continue serving the region as a Councilmember.
