

S.F. No. 805 – Vehicle Registration Self-Service Kiosks (as amended by the A-4 amendment)

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Section 1. Motor vehicle registration self-service kiosks. This section authorizes self-service kiosks to be used for motor vehicle registration renewals.

Subd. 1. Authorization. The commissioner of public safety, in consultation with deputy registrars, must establish a process to implement and install self-service kiosks that may be used for motor vehicle registration renewals. The commissioner must establish minimum standards for the kiosks. A kiosk must: 1) allow a customer to renew a motor vehicle registration without assistance from a deputy registrar; 2) dispense license plate tabs; and 3) display contact information for the responsible deputy registrar. This section only applies to deputy registrars.

Subd. 2. Administration. The commissioner must contract with a vendor to provide the kiosks. The vendor must provide training to the deputy registrars on operating the kiosks and troubleshooting issues. A deputy registrar may request that the commissioner place a kiosk in the deputy registrar's service area. The commissioner may approve the placement. The deputy registrar is responsible for the kiosk. The deputy registrar may coordinate with the vendor for administration of the kiosks.

Subd. 3. Fees. The commissioner may assess a convenience fee of \$5 or less on each transaction completed at a kiosk. The vendor keeps these fees. The deputy registrar filing fees apply to kiosk transactions and the deputy registrars keep these fees.

Section 2. Vehicle registration self-service kiosk report. By December 1, 2022, the commissioner of public safety must report to the legislature on the self-service kiosks.

Section 3. Appropriation. This section appropriates \$250,000 in fiscal year 2022 from the vehicle services operating account to the commissioner of public safety to implement the self-service kiosk program.

Sections 1 and 3 are effective the day following final enactment.
