Senator Murphy moved that the name of Senator Mitchell be stricken as a co-author to S.F. No. 2959. The motion prevailed.

Senator Murphy moved that the name of Senator Mitchell be stricken as a co-author to S.F. No. 2970. The motion prevailed.

Senator Johnson moved that the name of Senator Anderson be stricken as chief author and the name of Senator Holmstrom be added as chief author to S.F. No. 3016. The motion prevailed.

Senator Murphy moved that the name of Senator Mitchell be stricken as a co-author to S.F. No. 3299. The motion prevailed.

Senator Johnson Stewart moved that the name of Senator Abeler be added as a co-author to S.F. No. 3345. The motion prevailed.

Senator Johnson moved that the name of Senator Anderson be stricken as chief author and the name of Senator Holmstrom be added as chief author to S.F. No. 3514. The motion prevailed.

Senator Murphy moved that the name of Senator Mitchell be stricken as a co-author to S.F. No. 3519. The motion prevailed.

RECESS

Senator Murphy moved that the Senate do now recess subject to the call of the President. The motion prevailed.
