The Senate met at 11:00 a.m. and was called to order by the President.

CALL OF THE SENATE

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

S.F. No. 3625: A bill for an act relating to education; modifying provisions for educator licensing and standards; modifying rulemaking authority for paraprofessional credentials; providing for

additional data sharing agreements; modifying professional development requirements for mental health; extending an appropriation; amending Minnesota Statutes 2024, sections 120B.363, subdivisions 1, 2; 122A.09, subdivision 9; 122A.18, subdivision 8; 122A.182, subdivision 1; 122A.187, subdivision 6; Minnesota Statutes 2025 Supplement, sections 122A.18, subdivision 1; 122A.181, subdivision 3; 122A.182, subdivision 3; Laws 2024, chapter 115, article 10, section 5, subdivision 2.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

Page 2, after line 22, insert:

"Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 122A.092, is amended by adding a subdivision to read:

Subd. 10. **Early literacy field experience.** (a) A teacher preparation provider approved by the Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board to prepare teacher candidates to provide instruction in early literacy must require a supervised early literacy field experience aligned to evidence-based best practices in reading consistent with sections 120B.118 to 120B.124. The early literacy field experience requirement applies to teacher candidates who enroll in teacher preparation programs in the 2027-2028 school year or later.

(b) The early literacy field experience must be integrated with learning experiences in reading instruction, including instruction on reading methods or equivalent, and must provide teacher candidates with opportunities to apply evidence-based literacy practices with students.

(c) The Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board must adopt rules regarding the early literacy field experience requirement, including but not limited to:

(1) defining licensure areas in which teacher candidates must complete the early literacy field experience;

(2) establishing expectations for the scope and outcomes of the early literacy field experience;

(3) ensuring the field experience occurs primarily within a school building during the instructional day, while allowing for waivers when appropriate to accommodate unique program delivery models or documented hardship; and

(4) requiring the field experience to include observation with actionable feedback to ensure growth and attainment of related reading standards.

(d) In adopting rules under this subdivision, the board must allow flexibility for teacher preparation programs to demonstrate that candidates have met required standards through field experiences.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective July 1, 2026."

Page 4, delete section 5

Page 6, line 4, delete "Minnesota-approved" and insert "state-approved"

Page 7, after line 17, insert:

"Sec. 11. **ONETIME FUND TRANSFER.**

Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, on June 30, 2026, the Professional Educator and Licensing Standards Board may permanently transfer any unexpended amount remaining in the background studies account in the special revenue fund, estimated to be \$....., to the general fund. Transferred funds must be used for costs of the board's online educator licensing system.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.

Sec. 12. **APPROPRIATION; EARLY LITERACY FIELD EXPERIENCE RULEMAKING.**

Subdivision 1. **Department of Education.** The sum indicated in this section is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Education in the fiscal year designated.

Page 2, after line 13, insert:

"(h) Within three months of the spending deadline imposed under paragraph (e), each county and Tribal government that receives aid under this section must submit the following information to the commissioner of revenue in the form and manner prescribed by the commissioner:

(1) the total number of households to which rental assistance was distributed;

(2) demographic characteristics of recipient households, including household size and income;
and

(3) the average amount of rental assistance distributed per recipient household.

Within five months of the spending deadline imposed under paragraph (e), the commissioner of revenue must compile the information received from counties and Tribal governments under this paragraph and submit the compilation in a report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over housing and taxes."

Subd. 18. **Supportive Housing**

(a) This appropriation is for the supportive housing program under Minnesota Statutes, section 462A.42. This is a onetime appropriation.

(b) Of this amount, \$9,000,000 is for grants to United States Department of Housing and Urban Development Continuum of Care Program grantees for fiscal year 2024 whose contracts have expired or will expire before December 31, 2026, and have experienced or will experience funding gaps. The agency may prioritize awards to grantees based on need. Notwithstanding the application provisions outlined in Minnesota Statutes, section 462A.42, subdivision 5, and the procurement provisions outlined in Minnesota Statutes, section 16C.06, subdivisions 1, 2, and 6, the agency may noncompetitively award grants to existing and previous federal Continuum of Care funding recipients. Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, section 462A.42, subdivision 4, funds may be used as supplemental emergency support resources for permanent supportive housing, rapid rehousing, transitional housing, and system-related activities for the identified grantees. The agency will coordinate with stakeholders on a distribution process and establish such a process within 30 days of enactment.

(c) Beginning 90 days after the agency obligates the appropriation and every 90 days thereafter, each grantee shall report to the commissioner detailing the use of grant funds and the number of people served. The requirement for a grantee to report to the commissioner under this paragraph expires upon submission of a final report to the commissioner following the exhaustion or return of grant funds. Within ten days after the reports from each grantee are due, the commissioner shall compile the reports

required by this paragraph from each grantee. The compiled report shall also identify any grantee that has not submitted a report required by this paragraph to the commissioner. The commissioner shall submit a copy of each compiled report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over housing. The commissioner shall also file each compiled report with the Legislative Reference Library in compliance with Minnesota Statutes, section 3.195.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment."
