S.F. No. 66: A bill for an act relating to drivers' licenses; reallocating fees to motorcycle safety fund and removing funding cap; amending Minnesota Statutes 2004, section 171.06, subdivision 2a.

Senators Reiter, Wergin, Limmer, Nienow and Koering introduced--

S.F. No. 67: A bill for an act proposing an amendment to the Minnesota Constitution, article IV, section 4; placing limits on the terms of office of legislators.

Senators Nienow, Wergin and Hann introduced--

S.F. No. 68: A bill for an act relating to motor vehicles; exempting combat wounded veterans from paying \$10 fee for special license plates; amending Minnesota Statutes 2004, section 168.123, by adding a subdivision.

Referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration.
