Nothing in this section affects a professional licensing board from taking action in response to violations of any other section of law.

Subd. 7. **Coverage.** Nothing in this section shall be construed to require that the costs associated with an investigational drug, biological product, or device be covered under private health coverage, a state public health care program, the state employee group insurance program, or a program administered by a state or local government agency that provides health care services to inmates residing in a state or county correctional facility.

Subd. 8. **Liability.** Nothing in this section shall create a private cause of action against any health care provider or entity involved in the care of an eligible patient using an investigational drug, biological product, or device, for any harm done to the patient resulting from the investigational drug, biological product, or device, so long as the health care provider or entity is complying in good faith with the requirements of this section."
