H.F. No. 375: A bill for an act relating to local government; allowing a county board to appropriate money for a veterans memorial anywhere in the county; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 375.18, subdivision 10.

Page 7, delete subdivision 2 and insert:

"Subd. 2. **Appropriation.** (a) Unspent money remaining in the account established under Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 216C.412, on July 1, 2017, must be transferred to the energy fund account in the special revenue fund established under Minnesota Statutes, section 116C.779, subdivision 1.

(b) There is annually appropriated from the energy fund account in the special revenue fund established in Minnesota Statutes, section 116C.779, to the commissioner of commerce money sufficient to make the incentive payments required under Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 216C.415.

(c) Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 216C.412, subdivision 1, none of this appropriation may be used for administrative costs."

Page 7, line 21, delete "December 31, 2017" and insert "October 31, 2018"

Page 7, line 27, delete "December" and insert "October 31, 2028."

Page 7, delete line 28

Page 8, after line 9, insert:

"Sec. 8. **APPROPRIATION.**

\$100,000 in fiscal year 2018 and \$100,000 in fiscal year 2019 are appropriated from the energy fund account in the special revenue fund established in Minnesota Statutes, section 116C.779, subdivision 1, to the commissioner of commerce to administer the "Made in Minnesota" solar energy production incentive program in Minnesota Statutes, section 216C.417. Any remaining unspent funds cancel back to the energy fund account at the end of the biennium.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment."

Page 8, after line 13, insert:

"(c) Laws 2013, chapter 85, article 6, section 11, is repealed.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment."
