SPECIAL ORDER

S.F. No. 1003: A bill for an act relating to transportation; designating the Richard J. Ames Memorial Highway; amending Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 161.14, by adding a subdivision.

Senator Pratt moved to amend S.F. No. 1003 as follows:

Page 1, line 8, delete "shall be known" and insert "is designated"

Page 1, delete lines 21 and 22 and insert:

"(b) Subject to section 161.139, the commissioner must adopt a suitable design to mark this highway and erect appropriate signs on the trunk highway portions of the route, and the local road authorities must erect appropriate signs on the local roadway portions of the route, with the cost of the signs to be paid by nonpublic sources of funds."

Page 2, delete lines 1 to 3

The motion prevailed. So the amendment was adopted.

S.F. No. 1003 was read the third time, as amended, and placed on its final passage.

The question was taken on the passage of the bill, as amended.
