INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF SENATE BILLS

The following bills were read the first time.

Senators Pratt, Draheim, and Coleman introduced--

S.F. No. 35: A bill for an act relating to transportation; appropriating money for safety improvements on U.S. Highway 169 in Scott County; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

Referred to the Committee on Transportation.

Senators Kunesh, Latz, Dziedzic, and Oumou Verbeten introduced--

S.F. No. 36: A bill for an act relating to public safety; establishing a reward fund for information on missing and murdered Indigenous relatives; appropriating money; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 299A.

Referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety.

Senators Kunesh, Dziedzic, Pappas, Murphy, and McEwen introduced--

S.F. No. 37: A bill for an act relating to state government; proposing an amendment to the Minnesota Constitution, article I, by adding a section; providing for equality under the law.

Referred to the Committee on State and Local Government and Veterans.

Senator Pratt introduced--

S.F. No. 38: A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for restoration of the Minnesota River riverbank in the Shakopee area; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

Referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

Senators Kunesh, Kupec, Gustafson, and Mitchell introduced--

S.F. No. 39: A bill for an act relating to agriculture; providing funding for pollinator research; transferring money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 18B.051.

Senators Hauschild, Dziedzic, Farnsworth, Eichorn, and McEwen introduced--

S.F. No. 40: A bill for an act relating to unemployment insurance; providing for additional benefits.

Senator Rest introduced--

No. 41: A bill for an act relating to energy; providing for a revenue-neutral assessment on environmental emissions; providing for refundable FICA and property tax credits; providing for credits against income taxes to be paid as dividends; authorizing loans for energy efficiency and renewable energy projects; providing rulemaking authority; requiring reports; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 273.1392; 273.1393; 275.065, subdivision 3; 276.04, subdivision 2; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapters 273; 290; proposing coding for new law as Minnesota Statutes, chapter 216I.

Referred to the Committee on Energy, Utilities, Environment, and Climate.

Senators Klein and Rest introduced--

S.F. No. 42: A bill for an act relating to taxation; individual income; providing a refundable credit for investments in energy efficient home improvements, electric vehicles, and renewable energy; appropriating money; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 290.

Referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Senator Champion introduced--

S.F. No. 43: A bill for an act proposing an amendment to the Minnesota Constitution, article I, section 2; prohibiting slavery or involuntary servitude as criminal punishment for a crime.

Referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety.

Senator Champion introduced--

S.F. No. 44: A bill for an act relating to human rights; adding a definition of race to the Minnesota Human Rights Act; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 363A.03, by adding a subdivision.

Referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety.

Senators Klein and Rest introduced--

S.F. No. 45: A bill for an act relating to taxation; converting the property tax refund program to a refundable income tax credit; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 270B.12, subdivision 8; 289A.38, subdivision 4; 289A.56, subdivision 6; 289A.60, subdivision 12; 290A.02; 290A.03, subdivisions 3, 6, 8, 12; 290A.04, subdivision 1; 290A.05; 290A.07, subdivision 2a; 290A.08; 290A.09; 290A.091; 290A.13; 290A.19; 290A.25; 462A.05, subdivision 24; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 290; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 290A.03, subdivisions 9, 11; 290A.04, subdivisions 2a, 5; 290A.23, subdivision 1.

Referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Senators Marty, Fateh, Rest, and Dziedzic introduced--

S.F. No. 46: A bill for an act relating to state government; requiring the state forecast include the rate of inflation; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 16A.103, subdivisions 1a, 1b.

Referred to the Committee on Finance.

Senators Pappas, Seeberger, Westlin, Mitchell, and Pha introduced--

S.F. No. 47: A resolution memorializing Congress to resolve that the requirements have been met to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) and that it shall now be known as the Twenty-Eighth Amendment to the Constitution.

Referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety.

Senators Dibble, Port, and Carlson introduced--

S.F. No. 48: A bill for an act proposing an amendment to the Minnesota Constitution, article I, by adding a section; providing for free, fair, and equal elections.

Referred to the Committee on Elections.

Senators Wiklund and Maye Quade introduced--

S.F. No. 49: A bill for an act relating to human services; establishing transitional cost-sharing reduction, premium subsidy, small employer public option, and transitional health care credit; expanding eligibility for MinnesotaCare; modifying premium scale; requiring recommendations for alternative delivery and payment system; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 62V.05, by adding a subdivision; 256L.04, subdivisions 1c, 7a, 10, by adding a subdivision; 256L.07, subdivision 1; 256L.15, subdivision 2; 290.06, by adding a subdivision.

Referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services.

Senators Cwodzinski, Mann, Port, Frentz, and Coleman introduced--

S.F. No. 50: A bill for an act relating to education finance; requiring school districts to provide access to menstrual products for students; increasing operating capital aid to fund school district

purchases of menstrual products; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 121A.21; 126C.10, subdivisions 13, 13a, 14.

Referred to the Committee on Education Finance.
