WHEREAS, the Portland Prairie 4-H Club will celebrate its 100th anniversary July 23, 2023, in Eitzen, Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, the Portland Prairie 4-H Club motto is "Make the Best Better!"; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the State of Minnesota that it wishes the Portland Prairie 4-H Club continued success in the future and encourages them to continue to "Make the Best Better" for another 100 years.
