Background Checks for Firearm Transfers in Minnesota

- No state or federal background check requirement for transfers of any firearm between <u>private parties</u> living in Minnesota.
- Background checks required for transfers of <u>pistols and SAMSAWs</u> from <u>dealers</u>.
 Federal law requires National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) check.
 State law has add on that transferee must produce a valid permit to purchase (also known as a transferee permit) or permit to carry (both of which require background checks at time of issuance) or that a transfer report be filed with local law enforcement (this also prompts a background check).
- Background checks required for transfers of <u>other firearms</u> (long guns) from <u>dealers</u>. Federal NICS check only. No additional state law add on.
- Federal NICS check occurs at point of sale and is typically instantaneous.
- State background check requirements (applicable only to transfers of pistols and SAMSAWs from a dealer) take time (five business days/seven days for permit to purchase or transfer report, 30 days for permit to carry). A person wanting to fulfill the state background check requirement and not face a waiting period at the point of sale must already have a valid permit to purchase or carry.
- Permits to carry are valid for five years and require training and a fee. Background check at time of issuance. Requires subsequent annual electronic background checks and authorizes additional checks at discretion of law enforcement.
- Permits to purchase are free and valid for one year. Background check at time of issuance. No provision for follow-up background checks.
- Transfer reports are free and valid for a single transfer (which can involve multiple firearms) but result in a waiting period to complete the transfer.
- State law provides exceptions to the transfer requirements for certain transfers (specified loans, repairs, etc.).
